George Graham Vest (1830–1904) served as U.S. Senator from Missouri from 1879 to 1903 and became one of the leading orators and debaters of his time. This delightful speech is from an earlier period in his life when he practiced law in a small Missouri town. It was given in court while representing a man who sued another for the killing of his dog. During the trial, Vest ignored the testimony, and when his turn came to present a summation to the jury, he made the following speech and won the case.

TRIBUTE TO THE DOG

George Graham Vest, Trial of Old Drum, September 23rd, 1870

Gentlemen of the Jury: The best friend a man has in the world may turn against him and become his enemy. His son or daughter that he has reared with loving care may prove ungrateful. Those who are nearest and dearest to us, those whom we trust with our happiness and our good name may become traitors to their faith. The money that a man has, he may lose. It flies away from him, perhaps when he needs it most. A man's reputation may be sacrificed in a moment of ill-considered action. The people who are prone to fall on their knees to do us honor when success is with us, may be the first to throw the stone of malice when failure settles its cloud upon our heads.

The one absolutely unselfish friend that man can have in this selfish

world, the one that never deserts him, the one that never proves ungrateful or treacherous is his dog. A man's dog stands by him in prosperity and in poverty, in health and in sickness. He will sleep on the cold ground, where the wintry winds blow and the snow drives fiercely, if only he may be near his master's side. He will kiss the hand that has no food to offer. He will lick the wounds and sores that come in encounters with the roughness of the world. He guards the sleep of his pauper master as if he were a prince. When all other friends desert, he remains. When riches take wings, and reputation falls to pieces, he is as constant in his love as the sun in its journey through the heavens.

If fortune drives the master forth, an outcast in the world, friendless



and homeless, the faithful dog asks no higher privilege than that of accompanying him, to guard him against danger, to fight against his enemies. And when the last scene of all comes, and death takes his master in its embrace and his body is laid away in the cold ground, no matter if all other friends pursue their way, there by the graveside will the noble dog be found, his head between his paws, his eyes sad, but open in alert watchfulness, faithful and true even in death.



Hello Friends!

Hope and pray you are well! The season of spring has arrived in Cyprus and we are enjoying the comfortable weather and flowers blooming.

It's been a busy start to the year for us with running a 3 month YWAM internship. We had 4 ladies join us to grow in understanding and developing their call into the Middle East. The internship included Arabic language training, input on spiritual formation, personal development, and cross cultural ministry. We also provided hands on training by giving them opportunities to help us develop our refugee community center. It was a full and fruitful season. We ended our time together last Friday, and it was so encouraging to hear how the Lord met with each of the interns and solidified their call and next steps in ministry. Two of the ladies will be joining our team for the next couple of years, one returned to minister in Iraq, and the other one hopes to continue on with Arabic studies in Jordan. We are thrilled that each one will continue on in this part of the world! It was a joy to pour ourselves into this internship, but also were ready to get back to normal rhythms of life.

Some of the highlights with refugees during the internship:

- Hosting movie nights Narnia.
- Hosting Ramadan meals with families.
- Facilitating a weekly Drop In Cafe focused on English language practice, refugee info and advice, and building community.
- Facilitating a weekly Women's Café, pouring into their God given identity and value through creativity.
- Organizing a couple of after school children's events having fun and sharing Biblical stories.
- Organizing our yearly backpack distribution (70-100 bags) this year we gave some in Limassol and Nicosia. We were able to pray and give out Bibles to most of these recipients as well.
- Serving refugee ministries in other cities during the kids midterm break we organized a program in Nicosia with a ministry to women who have survived trafficking, and we organized a children's event at a refugee ministry in Paphos.
- Getting into the local Mosque on the Night of Power (Jon).

We are so thankful for the grace of the Lord during a busy season. We felt He strengthened us so that we could pour into our family, the interns, and refugees. We would appreciate prayers personally as we need the Lord's refilling and refreshing.

And now, Cyprus will begin celebrating Easter. It's a beautiful season here with lots of symbolic celebrations. We are excited that Michelle's parents and sister will be here to celebrate with us! They will be visiting for 2 weeks. Also, we will celebrate Lily's 13th birthday while they are here.

Then the first week of May, Jon has a trip to Iraq. He will be speaking at the YWAM staff gathering there. We would appreciate your prayers.
