PARISH HALL "KICK-OFF" BANQUET, NOVEMBER 20

Thursday, November 20, is going to be one of the biggest days in the history of St. John's Lutheran Church.

Why? Because, on that day will be held the "Kick-Off" banquet for our Parish Hall fund raising drive. Be sure to save the date on your calendar.

Also, the annual Thanksgiving dinner will be held in conjunction with the 'Kick-Off" festivities.

The affair will be held at the Twin Valley Rod and Gun Club starting at 6:30 p.m. The dinner will be prepared and served by the Women's Missionary Society and a free will offering will be received. Any profits from the evening will be turned over to the building fund.

As you most know, the congregation voted to buy an additional one and one half acres of land for use in our building program.

The program for the evening will feature short reports from Kenneth Duncan, chairman of the Executive Building Committee; Robert Barton, Christian Education Committee chairman; Kenneth Spitler, Furnishings and Equipment chairman; Robert Stiver, Fellowship and Recreation, chairman and Robert Woodard, Financing chairman. Pastor Kettlehake and Mr. Duncan will answer any questions regarding what has been done so far.

The Sunday before the "big night," each member of the congregation will receive a combined report from each of these committees with their suggestions. You are asked to read it over and be ready to add to the list on the night of the banquet.

If the program proceeds as planned, we should be able to break ground in the spring and by early 1960 be using the new unit.

Of course, ground cannot be broken without the cooperation of

every member of the congregation. Only through the Grace of God and the sacrifice of each member will the first brick be laid.

So make plans now to attend the gala evening. You do not have to bring anything except yourself and your committment to Jesus Christ.

LAND, HO!

Another hurdle has been surmounted at St. John's. The way has been cleared by our members for more land on which to construct our new Parish Hall.

On Sunday, October 12, the congregation voted to buy land from Mr. James Cooper and Mrs. Mamie Wachtel at a cost of \$2,300 for one and one-half acres.

This new ground is located immediately to the west and north of our present church lot.

With this plat, and with the land that has been given us by Mr. and Mrs. Vol Paullus, we are no longer crowded.

May we thank the Lord for this step forward.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATOR TO VISIT ST. JOHN'S
