

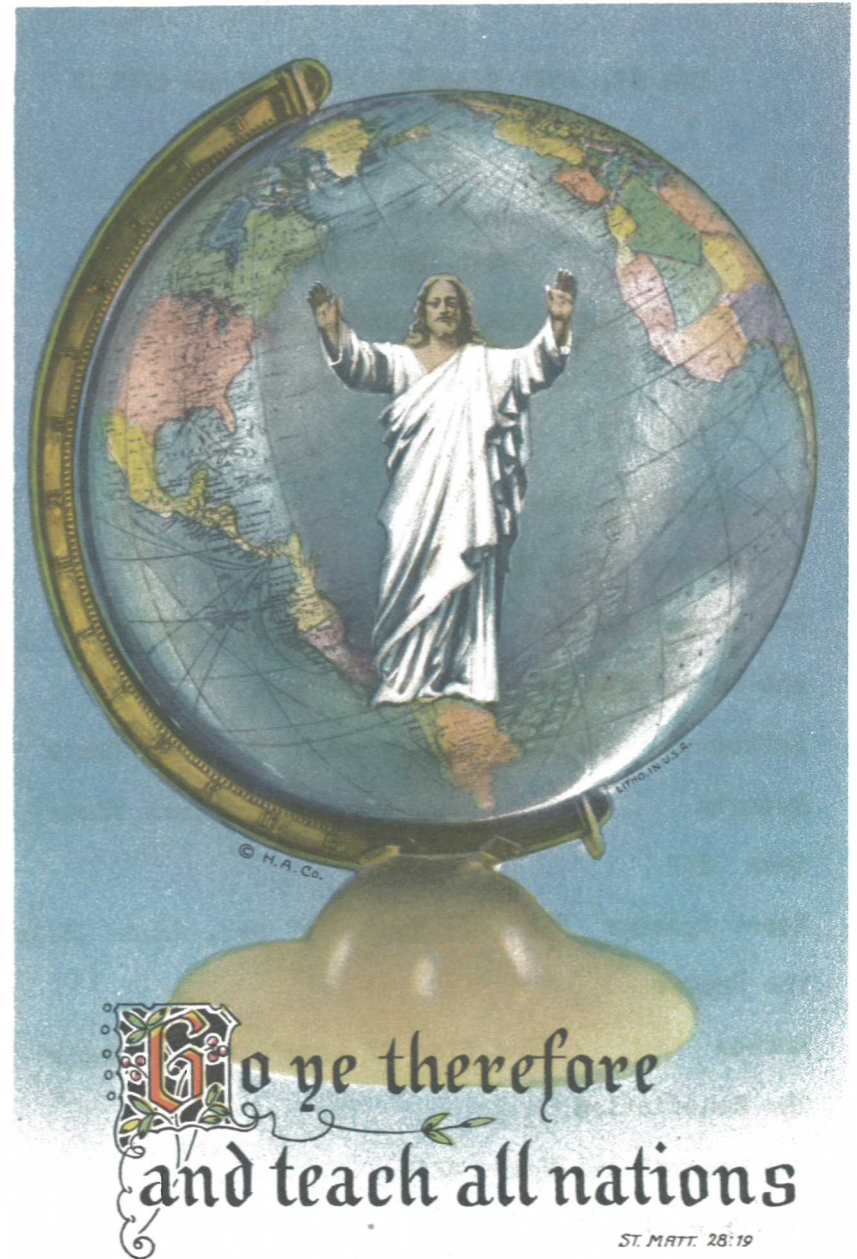

WILLING WORKERS' MISSIONARY SOCIETY

Feeling that they wanted to have an active part in the spreading of God's Word and wanting to help in the building of their church the women of the St. John Ev. Lutheran Church in Ingomar organized the Willing Workers Missionary Society on Jan. 21, 1904 as a combined Ladies Aid and Missionary Society.

There were 17 charter members of the Society four of whom are still living; Mrs. Orpha Etter, Mrs. Zora Heisman, Mrs. Lola Paullus, and Mrs. Mamie Wachtel. The latter two are still active in the work of the Society.

The members worked hard in helping to build St. John Church to provide contributions and in performing actual labor when the church was built.

Through the years the members have continued to help financially in providing improvements for the church in addition to the chief work of the Society, that of carrying the Gospel to all people through the work of missions. To that end the Society is affiliated with with the Women's Missionary Society of the Synod of Ohio and of the United Lutheran Church in America.

The present membership is 42 and the Society has 15 Life Members of the Women's Missionary Society.
